### **Major in Nursing Service Administration**

The graduates:

### **Major in Maternal and Child Health**

4. exhibit knowledge and skills in research-based maternal and child health;
5. utilize competence and social justice concepts, community partnership development, and ethical standards in the maternal and child health practice;
6. serve effectively as client partner and advocate within the health care delivery system; and
7. create relevant programs for extension services.

Admission:

- Applicants to any masters degree must have an appropriate undergraduate or baccalaureate degree or its equivalent from reputable institution of higher learning.
- Applicants to the programs whose fields of specialization are not in line or aligned with the degree applied for may be required to take 12 units of the specialization in the undergraduate level.

Documentary Requirements for Admission

- Duly signed application form
- Original Transcript of Records (TOR)
- Three (3) copies of passport size pictures (clear and not pixelated)
- Passport or Certificate of Live Birth issued by the National Statistics Office (NSO)

- Any proof of good citizenship and of no pending court case.
- Payment of a non-refundable application fee of P3,500.00 or USD 80.00
- Application of all foreign students shall be processed in accordance with existing rules and regulations imposed by the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) and the Philippine Bureau of Immigration.
- Pledge by a student to abide by and comply with the rules and regulations of IFSU and Philippines.

The Teaching methods used is Blended Learning in which 70% of it is using the Learning Management System (LMS), and the other 30% is by face to face discussion.
