IFSU INKS PARTNERSHIP WITH BSP

The Ifugao State University (IFSU) and Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas (BSP) signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) on the BSP Knowledge Resource Network at the Audio Visual Room, University Library, Main Campus on May 9, 2018.

Dr. Serafin L. Ngohayon and BSP Director Rogel Joseph D. Del Rosario headed the Ribbon Cutting and Launching of the BSP Knowledge Resource Collection (KRC) located at the Periodical Section of the University Library.

The BSP KRC is an initiative at information and knowledge sharing that aims to enhance the public's understanding of economic and financial concepts and issues.

The KRC houses updated BSP publications such as books, reports, guides, manuals, primers and brochures, as well as provide access to online publications and research assistance services to the public. *Plorida B. Robles*

BSP lectures on counterfeit money

The Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas (BSP) gave trivia to IFSU students and employees on how to make sure that the money is not counterfeit at the Audio Visual Room, University Library, Main Campus on May 9, 2018.

BSP Director Rogel Joseph D. Del Rosario said that the basic premise against money is its feel.

He added that banknotes are printed on special paper that gives them their unique feel. The printed line and colors on the banknotes are sharp, clear and free from smudges. By running your finger across the front of the note you can feel raised prints in areas such as the words "REPUBLIKA NG PILIPINAS" and denomination in words, portrait, signatures and lower right value panel on the face of the note.

Other features can be observed by examining the watermark. A shadow image of the portrait and the denominational value appears at the blank space when the note is viewed against the light from either side. Inspect the Fiber. Red and Blue visible fibers embedded randomly on the paper.

View the embedded security thread. For 20 and 50 peso bill – an embedded thread running vertically across the notes is seen from the either side when viewed against the light.

View the windowed security thread. For 100-, 200-, 500- and 1000- Piso – A stitch-like metallic thread running vertically across the note, which changes color from red to green when viewed at different angles. This thread bears the alphanumeric denominational value cleartext seen in front and the "BSP" imprint found at the back, both in repeated series.

Check the concealed value. The denominational value superimposed on the smaller version portrait at the upper left side of the notes becomes visible when the note is rotated 45 degrees and tilted down.

Check the optically variable ink. Embossed 1000 denominational value at the lower right corner of the face of the note, which when viewed at different angles, changes from green to blue.

Check the serial number. Composed of 1 or 2 prefix letters and 6 to 7 asymmetric (increasing in size) digits located at the lower left and upper right corners of the face of the note.

Check the See-through Mark. The word "Pilipino" written in Baybayin (pre-Spanish Philippine alphabet) is seen in complete form when the note is viewed against the

light.

Check the Optically Variable Device (OVD) Patch. A reflective foil that bears the image of the image of the Blue-naped Parrot (for 500)/ South Sea Pearl inside an oyster (for 1000) and small BSP logo. The background and the parrot/oyster exchange color when the note is rotated at 90 degrees, i.e, red parrot/oyster becomes green while the green background becomes red.

Philippine NGC Coin Series

Meanwhile, the BSP also disclosed the New Generation Currency (NGC) Coin Series which will be formally launched next month, July 2018.

The NGC Coin Series features the endemic flora of the Philippines: the Kapa-kapa, Tayabak, Walingwaling, Katmon, Kapal-kapal Baging, and Mangkono whose varying characteristics of beauty, toughness, versatility, and adaptability run parallel to Filipinos' resilience and grace under pressure, facing adversity head-on but with a smile, carrying on to greater heights, and never losing but letting that distinct Philippine identity shine through.

However, the BSP clarifies that, the existing coin series shall remain to be legal tender and can be used alongside with the NGC Coin Series for day to-day transactions to pay for goods and services, until such time as the BSP calls for the demonetization of the said BSP Coin Series.

IFSU Hosts Provincial SK Mandatory Training

The Sangguniang Kabataan (SK) Mandatory Training for the Province of Ifugao was held at Ifugao State University as the service provider from May 17-24, 2018.

The SK chairmen and kagawads from the different municipalities of Ifugao undergone a seven-day training on different modules.

Regina Elizabeth L. Mammag, Officer-In-Charge Provincial Director, Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG)-Ifugao reminded the SK officials that under Republic Act No. 10742, otherwise known as "The Sangguniang Kabataan Reform Act of 2015," and its Implementing Rules and Regulations, specifically Rule V states that capability-building and orientation towards nation-building and empowerment, Section 27: Mandatory and Continuing Training Programs, states that should be conducted for incoming SK officials.

The law further higlights that, for the purpose of emphasizing the role of the youth in nation-building and molding them to become better citizens with the values of patriotism, nationalism and honor as a Filipino, any Sangguniang Kabataan official, whether elected or appointed, or any member of the Local Youth Development Council (LYDC) must undergo the mandatory training programs before he or she can assume office.

She further states that, "During their incumbency, they must attend the continuing training programs to be undertaken by the Commission in coordination with the DILG. Deliberate failure to attend the said training programs shall constitute sufficient ground to disqualify said Sangguniang Kabataan official or LYDC member or subject them to disciplinary actions."

"If there is one thing that must have changed the world in terms of peace and order, it was not the threat of missiles and nuclear wars but sports diplomacy,"

said Ryan C. Guinaran, guest speaker during the opening program of the Association of State Colleges and Universities – Solid North (ASCU - SN) Olympics.

ASCU – SN Olympics, an annual sports event for employees of the state universities and colleges in Northern Philippines, was hosted by Benguet State University from June 18 – 21, 2018.

The Ifugao State University (IFSU) employeeathletes and IFSU President Dr. Eva Marie C. Dugyon expressed appreciation to Guinaran's message that revolved around the event's theme: "Gaining Skills, Advocating Gender Sensitivity and Developing Ties thru Sports and Wellness".

Guinaran said gaining skills may not pertain to the fastest and the strongest but the strategies and the teamwork in order to win.

On gender sensitivity, Guinaran explained that it is not about sexual orientation but about equally recognizing everyone's potential and providing the opportunity for self-growth.

On developing ties, he said it is about camaraderie that would counter interpersonal conflicts which are the biggest barrier in government institutions.

"I've been a consultant for the past fifteen years in government institutions and what weakens the link is relationship barriers. Based on studies, 20% of the office hours are spent on pacifying or on reconciliations. It costs our state universities and colleges a lot of time and money. Hence, this is the time for us to be more efficient, to develop as a team. We are not here to compete but to complement. We are not here to suppress but to supplement. If you have to compete, compete only in one way and that is to be the best team player," Guinaran said.

IFSU Vice President for Academic Affairs Dr. Nancy Ann P. Gonzales was heard saying the guest speaker was able to capture and sustain the attention of the ASCU – SN participants.

Dr. Ryan Guinaran is a member of the Benguet State University Board of Regent representing the private sector and Consultant for local health governance.
